











Ingleborough (The Blue Hill)

The whole of Ingleborough is designated as a Site of Special Scientific Interest for its unique combination of limestone karst features and associated flora. Ingleborough is also recognised as an important wildlife site by the European Union being a Natura 2000 Site.

The Ingleborough National Nature Reserve, which extends to 1,000ha is renowned for the wildlife and geology of its limestone pavements and post glacial features.

The limestone pavements are home to a wonderful variety of wild flowers of woodland origin with rare ferns sheltered in the deep "grikes".


The whole of the Ingleborough massif is surrounded by a system of underground caves containing some of the most important deposits of post glacial sediments which tell the story of ice ages of the past 350,000 years.

Mon 7 July

Langcliffe Ouarry / Craven Lime Work An easy 1 mile (1.6km) walk exploring

this fascinating site, looking at the three limekilns and learning about the varied history, as well as seeing how nature has once again taken control!


