The Bethany Project

Our February Charity Coffee Pot is in aid of the Bethany Project.

This is a well-established charity that was set up and run by small team of Christians (mainly from East Lancs., near Accrington) who work together to help the most vulnerable children and people in a rural area of Tanzania in East Africa.

The charity runs a children's home and a school in Mwanza next to Lake Victoria, caring for more than 150 children in their children's home, and over 350 children in their school.

From their previous time in East Lancs., Pam and Tim have had links to this project for over 20 years and they were a great help when Tim was setting up the Isaiah Trust, a similar project working with Street Children in Kenya.

Ingleton Methodist Church have also been involved with and have supported this charity for many years and a couple of the stewards from Ingleton lived and worked out there a few years ago. A few of the members at IMC have already been out to Tanzania to help with the work there and another visit is in the planning stage at the moment; anyone interested would be hugely welcome to join!

Our Charity Coffee Pot will raise funds to put towards work that will be done on this next visit.

CARBONFAST FOR CREATION LENT 2023

It seems that we have only just tidied up since Christmas, but Lent is only a few weeks away and the Eco Team want to share their ideas for Lenten Fasting.

How often do we begin Lent with determination and spirit-filled ideas to make this a meaningful period of self-sacrifice and then give up?

We would like to give the 6 weeks some structure and split it into 6 clearly defined stages to help you start afresh each week. These are the 6 stages:

- Week 1 Week of Preparation
- Week 2 Waste week
- Week 3 Food week
- Week 4 Energy week
- Week 5 Waste week
- Week 6 Nature week

We will be preparing a daily chart of activities that you might consider doing, related to each of the 6 stages. We will give you each a chart on the Sundays before Lent so that you might stick it on the fridge door or kitchen notice board. There is no requirement to do everything on the chart – do as much as you can and feel you ought to do. Many things you will already be doing as committed green Christians.

The Eco Team have committed to Carbonfasting this year and we hope you will want to join with us.

There are 2 dates that you may be interested in.

February 12th - Tim is planned to preach on this Sunday and he will be preaching on the subject of FairTrade. Apparently chocolate may be involved!!

March 1st – as part of FairTrade Fortnight, the charity Coffee Pot will be in aid of FairTrade and FairTrade products will be on sale. We hope you will be able to support this.

World Day of Prayer: 'I have heard about your faith'

A united service for the World Day of Prayer will be held at SS Mary and Michael Catholic Church at 7.00 pm on Friday 3rd March.

Our sisters in Taiwan have prepared this year's service. Taiwan is an island rich in natural resources and culturally diverse. The women of Taiwan share the issues faced geographically, politically and socially and also their hopes for the future. Let us join with them as we give thanks for the beautiful island and people of Taiwan and encourage one another in our faith, just as the apostle Paul did in his letters.

World Day of Prayer is an international, interchurch organisation which enables us to hear the thoughts of women from all parts of the world: their hopes, concerns and prayers. The Day of Prayer is celebrated in over 120 countries. It begins in Samoa and prayer in native languages travels throughout the world --- through Asia, Africa, the Middle East, Europe and the Americas before finishing in American Samoa some 38 hours later.

Dear God,

Today has been one of those horrible dreich days when it was too cold to venture far from the sofa, which is why this evening I was still sitting there with a mug of coffee, snuggled up, watching "Winterwatch" on the BBC with my cat. Suddenly a section came on which was simply 90 seconds of bird activity and song in a wintery garden. My cat sprang into life and edged as close as he could to the TV set, fascinated by the sound and the activity. His ears twitched, his eyes followed every movement and when the ninety seconds was over he returned to my side, sighed, curled up next to me and fell contentedly asleep. All day he'd been prowling around the house, mewing piteously and complaining because it was too cold and wet to go out and now he was soothed and at peace.

It got me thinking about how often I behave like he had behaved all day, how I grumble and complain when things don't immediately work out the way I want and, because I can't see the bigger picture and I don't get immediate gratification, I feel that I have been abandoned. My cat had wanted to go out and chase birds but couldn't, but when presented with a substitute that allowed him to stay warm and watch things from a safe. comfortable distance, he had the sense to enjoy the moment and then retire gracefully. I'm not entirely sure that I would do the same and act as sensibly; I suspect I would still mutter and grumble – but then, maybe I'm not quite as mature as my cat! Yours
