As this is the first time I have written for the Circuit Newsletter, I thought it would be a good idea to introduce everyone to EcoChurch and the vision we have for Settle Methodist Circuit. At St. John's in Settle we started our EcoChurch journey about 3 years ago and, as I write, we are in the process of being assessed for our Gold Award. If we are successful, we will be only the 6th Methodist church in the country and the 1st in the Yorkshire West District to achieve it.

Tim has sent out a challenge to the whole of the circuit to become an EcoCircuit, starting with Bronze Award and reaching Gold Award by 2030. The circuit meeting accepted the challenge and already Hellifield has taken practical steps towards reaching bronze: they expect to be able to submit their application within a few weeks.

We hope that the other churches will be able to embark on their own application soon. I am very happy to come to talk about the process; the bar is set deliberately low for the bronze award so that no-one should feel overwhelmed by the demands of becoming an EcoChurch. You are probably already well on the way without realising it!

FAITH & ARTS DEVELOPMENT LEAD (TOUCHSTONE, BRADFORD 2025)

We are seeking a person able to relate to spirituality, faith, and arts to appoint as the Faith & Arts Development Lead (Touchstone, Bradford 2025). The role will involve co-ordinating and developing opportunities for engagement between faith and arts, ultimately as part of Bradford 2025, in association with the Methodist Modern Art Collection loan programme.

Applicants will ideally hold a degree in an area of the Arts or theology, have experience of exhibition planning, art display and commissioning of creatives. The appointment also requires an enhanced DBS Disclosure. For full information about the responsibilities of the role, we encourage you to request an application pack.


