### Bentham: Planned Preaching development.

Keen to strengthen our grasp of the Bible, it seemed like a bold step when we moved to having Planned (Themed) Preaching as part of the quarterly Plan, but this has now become an established element of the three-monthly cycle. Starting two years ago when Jane Mansergh brought us, on three consecutive weeks, a series of sermons on Easter we now take a topic or book each plan. These have included a series on the life of Elijah, the book of 1 Peter, The Return of Christ and on the topic of Mission. We were greatly blessed in January to have had local farmer and preacher John Fox from Quernmore take three Sundays looking at the beatitudes from the Sermon on the Mount. In April we embark on our most ambitious series to date, with 7 consecutive Sunday morning services considering "Some Questions People asked Jesus". We begin with Rev. Tim tackling the question posed by the Apostle Paul on the road to Damascus, "Who Are You Lord?" and Rev. Tim will also conclude the series when he preaches on the follow up question "What shall I do Lord?". See Acts 22 for a taster. In between, among other questions, we will be asking, What must I do to inherit eternal life? and, Lord, Teach us to pray?

This series is timed to lead us towards our Lunch and Dream session in May when the church family will come together to seek the Lord for how He would have us serve Him, in caring for one another and reaching out to those who as yet do not know Jesus.
