Tragedy and triumph

Threads through the Cross is a spectacular, dramatic and moving exhibition of eighteen huge textile panels, telling key moments from the life, death and resurrection of Jesus.

The exhibition begins with the birth of Jesus and takes the viewer on a journey through pivotal scenes from his life, the crucifixion, the resurrection, and the powerful events of Pentecost.

One of the largest textile art projects ever created

Renowned textile artist Jacqui Parkinson brings the Gospel stories to life in a vivid blend of silks, paint, leather and real gold leaf – incorporating over five million stitches. With an international reputation for large-scale, vibrant work, Jacqui's panels are nearly 3 metres high and up to 4 metres wide.

The images are dramatic and captivating, and the intricate stitching work is astonishing.

Part of a bigger picture

Threads through the Cross is the third part of a major project. Over the past ten years, Jacqui has created three distinct yet connected sequences that form Threads through the Bible.

The first two, *Threads through Revelation* and *Threads through Creation*, have already toured the UK – including a previous visit to Ripon. Together they've been seen by over a million people.

Now, for the first time, *Threads through the Cross* is available to view, and Ripon Cathedral is the only venue in North Yorkshire to host it this year.
